<u>1865 STATE CENSUS</u>	<p>Schedule III. "Additional Inquires Relating to Officers and Enlisted Men now in the Military or Naval Service of the United States". The entries are interspersed throughout each Town. The entry refers back to the page and line when the service man appears in the census. Information given includes the Regiment, etc. date, first rank &amp; term of enlistment at entry into service, promotion transfers, etc., and name of current regiment, (or vessel), rank &amp; any unexpired term of service as of June 1, 1865. There are also headings to indicate whether he was drafted, a substitute, or representative recruit.</p> <p>SCHEDULE IV. "Additional Inquires Relating to Officers &amp; Enlisted Men <u>Who Have Been</u> in Military or Naval Service in present war". These entries are with those of Schedule III and are made in the same manner. Additional information may include months in U.S. service, whether discharged, mustered out, etc., present health condition &amp; remarks.</p> <p>SCHEDULE VII. "Deaths of Officers and Enlisted Men, which have occurred while in the military or naval service of the U.S., or from wounds or disease acquired in said service since April 1861, reported by the families to which the deceased belonged when at home." Enlistment information given includes name, date &amp; class of entry, whether married or single, citizen or alien &amp; original rank &amp; unit. Also given is the age, rank &amp; unit at time of death.</p>	MAP ROOM

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DESCRIPTIVE BOOK OF THE REGIMENT, US	Contains list of Commissioned Officers, with dates of appointment, rank & remarks (promotions, discharges, resignations, desertions, deaths). Soldiers are listed alphabetically by Company A-K. Information given includes age, personal description (complexion, color of eyes & hair, height), and in what town or county and State born, occupation at time of enlistment and the particulars of enlistment (when, where, by whom & for how) and remarks including transfers, promotions, appointments, desertions, discharges & deaths. 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NEW YORK PENSION ROLL (undated)	Each County's Pensioners are listed alphabetically. Information given includes name, rank, annual allowance, sums received, description of service, when placed on pension roll, date pension started, age, laws under which pensioner was formerly on the pension roll & remarks. (There are some dates of death given.)	BASEMENT
REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION APPLICATIONS * (1820-1832)	These applications, filed by veterans of the Revolutionary War, have been abstracted & typed. (Also a book, <u>Delaware County's War Papers</u> , is for sale by the Delaware County Historical Assn.) Each applicant gives his age, rank, service record, occupation & family members with their names, ages & condition of health. He lists his possessions & estimates the value of each item. Indexed. MILITARY APPOINTMENTS * REMOVALS & DISCHARGES ①1802-1818]	Each document lists the person's name & the office to which he is appointed or removed from. These are abstracted, typed & indexed. (There are some militia lists, etc. which have not been abstracted, etc. in the basement.)	MAP ROOM
CIVIL WAR MUSTER ROLLS	Lists Regiments, etc. organized by New York State for U.S. Service during the Civil War. Officers & men are in separate alphabetical lists within each Regiment, Company Unit, etc. Information includes rank, age, enrollment information (when, where, by whom & for how long) & remarks are entered. MILITARY ENROLLMENT LIST (WORLD WAR I)	Enrollment of Persons liable to Service in the Militia under Chaper 41, Laws of 1909 & Acts Amendatory. Included are names, ages, addresses, dates of birth, occupation & any previous military or naval service of those enrolled. Listings are by Towns.	BASEMENT
WORLD WAR II	Draft records are in Albany, NY & Washington, D.C.	
SOLDIERS DISCHARGES A/K/A US WAR SERVICE DISCHARGES (1860s to date)	The early discharges include names, details of enlistment, service & discharge. Also given are ages, physical characteristics, date & place of birth and previous occupation. Later discharges include additional inforamtion such as battles, etc. involved in, wounds received, if any, ribbons, etc. awarded & physical condition at time of discharge. A Master Index is maintained.	MAP ROOM
CENSUS (1840 federal)	In each Town, the names & ages of "Pensioners for Revolutionary or Military Service" are written on the page opposite the name of the head of the household in which they are living.
